#### **Raquel Cavaco Nunes**

Raquel Cavaco Nunes has graduated in Law at Lisbon University. Alongside her work as a lawyer, she has been working in event and sports management. Raquel has taken part in 7 Olympic Games, including Rio 2016 where she was Venue Press and Photo Operations Manager. She has been the World Athletics Photo Commissioner since 2013.



#### **Ivo Gonzalez**

Ivo Gonzalez has been a sports photographer for more than 25 years and among the major sports events he has covered in his career it is worth highlighting seven FIFA World Cups and 5 Olympic Games. He acted as Photo Chief at the Rio 2016 Games and Deputy Photo Chief at the Pyeongchang 2018 Winter Games. Currently he is the Project Director in the Photo Operations department at the Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee and Deputy Photo Chief for the Beijing 2022 Winter Games.



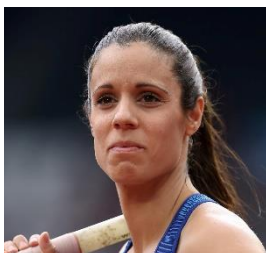
#### **Bob Martin**

Bob Martin is a multi-award-winning sports photographer. During a career spanning 30 years, Bob has photographed every major sporting event and has been recognised by more than 60 national and international awards. In 2017 he was awarded the coveted "Sports Photojournalist of the Year". His "1-1000th" photography book won the Sportel International Sports Book Award. Bob is Director of Photography and a co-founder of the agency "Silverhub Media".



#### **Thomas Röhler**

Thomas Röhler is a German javelin thrower, he is the current Olympic champion and has also won the latest European Championships on home soil in Berlin 2018. He is the third best javelin thrower of all-time with a personal best of 93.90m. Thomas is also a member of the World Athletics Athletes' Commission and a keen photographer himself in his own spare time.



#### **Katerina Stefanidi**

Katerina Stefanidi is a prolific Greek athlete specialised in the pole vault. She is the current Olympic champion and has also won the world title in London 2017. Her international career started in 2005 when she won the World U18 title aged 15. Stefanidi has a personal best of 4.91m which ranks her seventh on the world all-time list. She is also a member of World Athletics Athletes' Commission.
